### World Festival 2007

Thanks to all who took part in the 31st annual Rochester World Festival at Mayo High School. The Rev. Nick Mezacapa, Master of Ceremonies, opened the International Talent show on Mayo's stage Friday evening introducing an exciting performance of South American Rhythms by the RCTC's World Drummers directed by Denny McGuire. Talented dancers, under the direction of April Dahl, performed Cuban salsa, a tour of India in beautiful costumes, dances of the Philippines and Middle Eastern dances by the Blue Lotus Dance Troupe. John Berquist, our new Festival coordinator from Minnesota's Iron Range, introduced fellow Nordic singers to join him in performing a variety of Nordic songs and music. Chinese Folk Song Players and a Swiss Alp Horn trio followed a brief intermission. Middle Eastern Dance performed by the Blue Lotus concluded the evening performance. Refreshments were enjoyed by the participants and the audience in Mayo's large foyer following the show.

On Saturday Mayo High provided a large spaces for cultural displays that were set up and staffed by individuals from many parts of the world as well as many community organizations, international clubs, Peace Corps, Peace makers, Human Rights Commission. In Mayo HS's big gymnasium, Marcela and Gary Nixon and their volunteers set up a great variety of activities from Japanese origami, piñatas, helium balloons, puppets, Norwegian hearts. Tissue paper flowers as well as a story tent with books for children that were provided by First Steps and the Jim and Judy Sloan Foundation. Wonderful ethnic foods were prepared and sold in Mayo's large cafeteria kitchen by cooks from Korea, Vietnam, India, Germany Philippines, Malaysia, Somalia, Sudan and our own Native Americans. Many people help to make the World Festival happen each year. Major roles were played by members of the RIA board and many additional volunteers and participants. We thank all of them as well as the custodians and cafeteria staff at Mayo H.S. We will try to schedule the '08 Festival earlier in April next year so that we don't compete with many other community events. We hope that you will give us your advice and your help as we look begin to plan the '08 World Festival. If you have ideas the planning committee invites you to join in the planning for next year.
