We encourage them to get involved with RIA. Each spring, the RIA also donates two International Scholarship Awards. These annual scholarships awarded to second-year international students who pursue higher education at RCTC. They plan to a volunteer office with computer access for the 2 new laptop computers that IBM has donated for use by RIA. RIA will rent storage space for the supplies and paper records we must keep.
